

# **MID-AMERICA MUSIC FESTIVAL CAMPING**

**\*\*\*CAMPING IS PRIMITIVE STYLE – NO HOOK-UPS\*\*\***

## **Is a camping pass per-person or per-tent/car/RV?**

Camping passes are per-tent/car or RV. Each person at campsite must have a festival ticket to enter festival grounds and to enjoy any of the festival amenities. Camping and festival passes available online or at the gate.

## **May I park my vehicle next to my tent/RV?**

Yes, you may park next to your tent/camper; however, any guests visiting your campsite must park in General Parking and pay the weekend parking pass of \$5.

## **May I camp in my vehicle?**

You sure can! All vehicle campers must park in camping area and not General Parking. Camping is not allowed in the General Parking area.

## **May I bring my VW bus or travel trailer?**

Definitely! You will just need to purchase an RV pass. Each person at campsite must have a festival ticket to enter festival grounds and enjoy any of the festival amenities.

## **Will camping sell out?**

There is plenty of space for everyone.

## **Can I buy a camping pass at the festival?**

Yes, at the gate.

## **Do I need a camping pass to enter the camping area?**

You will need a camping pass to enter any camping areas.

## **Will you have quiet camping?**

We ask everyone to be respectful of all camping guests. Curfew is 12:30 a.m.

## **Will there be power?**

Power will not be provided for individual camping spots; however, generators are welcomed.

## **Will there be water?**

No hook-ups are provided.

## **Will there be handicap accessible parking?**

There will be handicap accessible camping parking near the shuttle drop off area.

## **Where do I park my vehicle?**

Campers may park their vehicle next to their camp area. All non-campers are to park in General Parking.

## **When may I check in/out to the camping area?**

Campgrounds open at 10 am on Friday, July 19. All campers must be checked out by 12 pm Sunday, July 21. Campers may request earlier check-in by emailing: [midamericamusicfestival@gmail.com](mailto:midamericamusicfestival@gmail.com)

## **If I don't check in on Friday, will I have a spot?**

If you bought a pass ahead of time, we will be sure to have room for you! Camping areas are first come first serve. No areas are reserved

## **May I buy food?**

There will be Food Trucks located inside the festival grounds. Food Truck hours are Friday, July 19 from 3 p.m. to 10:45 p.m. and Saturday, July 20 from 12 p.m. to 10:45 p.m.

## **May I buy supplies? Wood, ice, etc.**

Campers need to bring their own supplies.

## **Will there be showers?**

No showers available

## **Will there be restrooms?**

There will be port-a-potties scattered throughout the camping areas and festival grounds.

## **May I bring alcohol?**

Definitely! We have a limit of one case of beer, one box of wine and one bottle of liquor per campsite. Remember, no glass allowed. No alcohol can be brought into the festival grounds. Just in the campgrounds. The Beer Garden inside the festival grounds will provide a full bar.

## **What items are prohibited in campgrounds?**

These items ARE NOT allowed into the campgrounds:

- **NO Glass**  
Please don't bring any glass into the campgrounds. Festival takes place on the beautiful grounds of the Black Silo Winery in rural Trenton, so please also refrain from bringing styrofoam and please recycle everything you can.
- **NO Pyro Stuff**  
No tiki torches, fireworks or the like, please.
- **NO RVs in Tent Campground Area**  
We have a separate RV Campground area.
- **NO Pets**  
We adore our pets too, but please don't bring your animals.
- **NO Selling Stuff**  
No unlicensed vending or sponsor tents are allowed in our campgrounds.

## **Are firepits allowed?**

No, firepits are not allowed. No open fire on premises.

## **Are kids allowed?**

Yes. All teenagers (under 18) and kids are allowed in the campgrounds with a parent or guardian. Children 12 and younger are free and do not require a paid festival pass.

## **Are tents secured?**

There will be security onsite 24/7, but don't risk leaving valuables in vehicles and camping area. Mid-America Music Festival, Black Silo Winery & Black Silo Foundation representatives will not be responsible for lost or stolen items. All camping attendees are subject to search upon entry.

## **May I bring my pet?**

We adore our pets too, but please don't bring your animals.

## **Can I bring my own food and drink?**

Feel free to bring your own food and drink into campgrounds; however, campfire stoves that run on propane or charcoal are NOT allowed. No open fire is allowed on premises.

There will be Food Trucks located inside the festival grounds. Food Truck hours are Friday, July 19 from 3 p.m. to 10:45 p.m. and Saturday, July 20 from 12 p.m. to 10:45 p.m.

## **Do camping passes come with festival tickets?**

Camping passes are not included with Festival Passes. All campers must have a festival pass to enter festival grounds. Options are Daily Passes (\$49), 2-Day General Admission Passes (\$75) or 2-Day VIP Sponsor Passes & VIP Perks start at (\$500) and are tax deductible.

Festival passes may be purchased online, at the Black Silo Winery, Trenton Hy-Vee, all 10 BTC Bank Branches, The Spotted Dog in St. Joe and through our five participating charities: BTC Area Youth Benefit Corp., Camp Rainbow, Green Hills Women's Shelter, North Central Missouri Children's Advocacy Center, the Foundation Trust for Trenton High School.

## **Are there trees around campsites to hang hammocks?**

No, the Black Silo Winery grounds are a wide-open space on 70 beautiful acres.

## **How many tents are allowed per campsite?**

There is no limit on tent number or size per campsite. Each camping area is first come first serve within their boundaries, there are no set plots/campsites per person. Every person camping needs a camping wristband for the camping area.

## **Who do I contact if I have an issue while camping?**

To contact camping security, please seek security official. For emergencies, call 911. There is a medical tent on festival grounds for medical emergencies, staffed only during festival hours.
